Defense of Thesis Proposal

The candidate demonstrates mastery of an area of specialization by writing and defending a thesis proposal within the first 18 months of candidacy. A thesis committee, approved by the director of the Ph.D. program, advises the candidate on the proposed thesis research and administers the defense of thesis proposal.

The thesis committee is chaired by the thesis advisor and includes at least 3 other members. Three committee members (including the chair) must be full-time Dartmouth faculty members; of whom two must be from the Thayer School. One of the four should be from outside Thayer School (normally outside of Dartmouth) and a recognized expert in the research area.

The defense, which is public, centers on a presentation by the student of his or her proposed thesis research. The proposal should explain the scope and importance of the proposed research and plans for its completion, and should be understandable, at least in a general way, by students and faculty not in the subject area. Two (2) weeks in advance of the defense you must submit a written thesis proposal to your committee and a notice of the defense to the registrar for posting and distribution. The Defense of Thesis Proposal Form must be signed by committee members upon completion.
